Lipstick

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A lipstick is a cosmetic product designed to add color, texture, and protection to the lips. It's typically made from a blend of waxes, which give it structure and help it hold its shape; oils like castor, mineral, or lanolin oil, which provide smooth application and shine; and emollients, which keep the lips soft and moisturized. To this base, manufacturers add pigments for color, preservatives to extend shelf life, and sometimes fragrances, flavors, or moisturizing agents like vitamin E, shea butter, or aloe vera. Depending on the formula, the balance of waxes and oils changes — giving the lipstick its final finish, whether matte, creamy, or glossy.
